Start of the School Day

Join us for a FREE breakfast in the canteen from 8.15am. You can choose from a bacon or sausage barm, crumpets, toast and/or a hot chocolate.

Our school day starts at 8.25am and you must be in your form line at the side of Houghton building by this time.

Lunch Time and Snacks

A 'meal deal' can be purchased from the canteen for £2.50. This offer includes a meal and the choice of either a cake, fruit or yoghurt.

Please note that fizzy drinks/energy drinks are not permitted in school and will be confiscated and disposed of. Disposable plastic bottles of any drink are also not permitted. However, reusable water bottles can be brought in and used.

Subjects You Will Study

These are the subjects you will study and the number of lessons you will have on each of them a week.

English - 4 lessons (set 4 in each band will have 5 lessons) Maths - 4 lessons PE - 2 lessons Science - 3 lessons Spanish - 2 lessons (set 4 in each band will have 1 lesson) Sports Science - 1 lesson Technology - 1 lesson Art, Drama, Dance, Music, Geography, History, Computing and Philosophy & Ethics - 1 lesson each.

There will also be 1 lesson a fortnight for the Personal Development Curriculum which will be delivered on a rolling programme.

You will have 30 minutes of Morning Enrichment each morning which will include reading and activities around Literacy, Careers and Cultural Capital. One of these morning sessions each week will be an assembly.



Enrichments

Each week day after school there are enrichment sessions that allow you to learn new skills and to meet new people. At OCA, there are over 100 enrichment activities available for you to take part in each week. There is no cost to the vast majority, however some may include a nominal fee, such as, rock climbing. A timetable of all the enrichment activities will be made available to you.

...the hair and beauty salon is amazing! Just like DT and it's workshop.



Frequently Asked Questions

Question

What happens if I get lost?

During your first few days in Year 7, there will be lots of people in the corridors helping you to your lessons. If you find you have managed to lose the rest of your class and you feel a little bit lost, just speak to a member of staff or an older pupil and they will take you to where you need to be.

Question

What if I get lost and end up being late for my lesson – will I get into trouble?

No! Your teachers know that it will take you a bit of time to get used to the Academy and they will understand if you are a little late whilst you are finding your way around in the first week. The school seems big at first, but students quickly start to find their way around. Some people are confident that they know their way after a day or two and for others it may take a little longer. After you have been to all your classrooms a couple of times, it will not seem as much like a maze. Think back to when you started at your primary school; back then you probably thought that it was huge and I bet it seems tiny to you now!

Question

Is it true that you get picked on by the older students?

Definitely not! This is a rumour that has been going around for centuries and if you ask any member of staff or any of the older pupils, they will tell you it has never happened!

Question

What happens if I get bullied?

We have a ZERO tolerance policy on bullying at OCA. This means that bullying of any kind is NOT acceptable.

If you feel worried or upset about the way that someone is treating you then it is really important to tell someone. In school, there are lots of people you can talk to such as your Form Tutor, Assistant Head of Year, Head of Year or any other member of staff that you feel confident talking to. As soon as we know about a problem we can help you to deal with it. The staff in this school are very experienced in dealing with sensitive situations and treat each situation seriously. Don't be afraid to speak up, we are here to help!

Question What's the food like?

Fabulous! Our brilliant canteen staff love cooking you a range of different foods; crumpets, bacon barms, cheese on toast, jacket potatoes, curries, pasta, sandwiches, salads, chicken burgers to name but a few on the menu. If you arrive at school between 8.15am and 8:25am you will get a free breakfast too.

Question When can I go to the toilet?

Pupils are encouraged to go to the toilet at break and lunch times so that lessons are interrupted as little as possible. However, if you have a medical condition that means you may need to go to the toilet more often, we will issue you with a pass which you will need to show to the teacher.

Question How many breaks are there?

One morning break of 15 minutes and lunch time which is 30 minutes.

Question Will I see my friends from Primary School?

Yes, If you are coming from a primary school where some of your friends are also coming from then we will always try and place you in a form with someone you know. Some of these friends might also be in your lessons, but either way you will definitely be able to meet up with them at break, lunchtime and enrichment sessions.

Question How many different teachers will I have?

You will have about 10 different teachers in your first year but you will get to know many more through enrichment activities and house competitions.

Question Will I have to go to Enrichment?

All Year 7 students need to choose one enrichment activity to go to each week, you can go to more than one of them if you wish. It is up to you which activity and which night you attend. Enrichment is really important, not just to make new friends and learn new skills but to help you get that dream job. Employers, colleges universities and apprenticeships are increasingly looking for students who 'stand out', who have gone that extra mile and balanced their studies with enrichment activities. When you come to write your applications you will be able to give so many examples because you have attended enrichment for five years.

Question **Do we have assemblies?**

Yes. We love assemblies at our school. It's a time where we can get together as a year group or a house, learn and reflect on our cultural capitalrelevant events and celebrate our successes. This is part of our morning enrichment programme and you will have assembly once a week.

Question What if I'm shy or nervous?

That's completely normal. Even the brave among you will have butterflies on those first couple of days. It will pass as you get to know us and we get to know you. Once you have had a full week of lessons those nerves will soon start to go away. You will be very happy here.
