MUSIC

HALLÉ ORCHESTRA VISIT

On Tuesday 5th October 2021, students from Year 11 GCSE Music visited The Bridgewater Hall in Manchester to attend the 'Orchestra Through the Ages' concert performed by the prestigious Hallé Orchestra. The concert was dedicated to the set works, which the students are required to study as part of their GCSE course, and the performance included their specified set work '*Mozart's Clarinet Concerto in A major*, *K. 622, movt. 3, Rondo.*'

The concert included several famous pieces played live by the Hallé, producing a guided tour of music from the Baroque era through to modern day film music. Students were given a brief history of each era as well as a live musical analysis of the chosen pieces. The orchestra expanded in size before the students eyes, beginning with a relatively small orchestra containing strings and a few woodwind instruments to a vast symphony orchestra including a whole host of unusual instruments such as a cimbalom and cor anglais.

It was a fantastic experience for the students to see a range of music played by an orchestra and thank you to all the students who attended for their impeccable behaviour throughout the afternoon.

Year 10 - On Wednesday 17thNovember, Cronton college hosted a Prestigious Universities afternoon and OCA was one of the fortunate schools selected to take part..

On Friday 5th November, Miss Woolley from the Maths department organised for two representatives from the University of Liverpool to visit for the day to speak to year10 &11 students about STEM careers, study skills and maths problem solving. Students were delivered a one hour careers and STEM assembly followed by a hour workshop in advanced mathematical problem solving.

Students will attend Riverside college for a full day of hands on experience. They will take part in virtual welding, chocolate welding and trophy making.


St Helen's College Links.

OCA staff and students were invited to attend the official opening of the St Helens Centre for Precision Engineering on Thursday 18th November. It was officially opened by Metro Mayor - Steve Rotherham who unveiled a plaque on the night.

St Helen's College have carried out a major refurbishment of the Centre after investing over £750,000 in state-of-the-art machinery, partially funded by the Liverpool City Region Combined Authority (LCRA).

This recent investment ensures alignment with employer requirements and industry demand through training the next generation of skilled engineers.

The OCA technology teaching team went over to the college to support their opening event and took some photos of their amazing new facilities.

Students will be assessed on their understanding of this play as part of their G.C.S.E. Literature exam next summer and many students immediately commented that it had helped to develop their understanding of the playwright's use of props and dramatic entrances and exits.

At the end of the performance, the actors were questioned whilst in role. Our students asked some interesting and challenging questions which the actors clearly enjoyed responding to.

A group of Year 10 students who are studying G.C.S.E Drama were also invited to attend and spent time discussing career options and even gained some tips for memorising their lines!

Our next step is to take students to the theatre once the official touring production comes to Manchester.

MATHS

Chess Club is provided by the maths department to help our students enhance their critical thinking skills and ability to problem solve. OCA IN THE COMMUNITY

Our Year 9 hosted a community event in October as this was the theme for their personal development lessons.

Prior to the event, students learnt all about communities: what makes a community and how to promote greater community cohesion. As part of the sessions students talked about what community means to them and how they were able to have a positive impact on their local community.

All Year 9s took part; each form took part in a fundraising event. They firstly selected a local charity of their choice and their preferred method of fund raising funds. The students set up in the school hall for their event after school before the doors opened to the rest of the school!

The event started with a 30 minute talk from Nicola Donoghue who is part of the team from the Widnes and Runcorn cancer support group. Nicola discussed with students the challenges that families face living with cancer.

Students set up stalls selling cake, raffle tickets, bingo, hot drinks and sweets, as well as a wet sponge challenge where students and staff nominated themselves to have wet sponges thrown at them to raise funds! One form decided to collectively run a marathon in a hour with some of the students running over 6 miles towards their 26 mile total. That one form raised over £130 in sponsors alone. The event was a success raising nearly £300 for the students chosen charities.
