

CAMPUS FACILITIES



Crescent Building

The Crescent Building is home to a wide range of subjects, everything from Health and Education to History and Public Services. It is also where you will find the Crescent Café and a Starbucks with space to relax outside.

Lewis Carroll Building

With eight classrooms over two floors, this state-of-the-art facility is home to our IT courses, 200 computers and a social study area available to all students.

Learning Resource Centre

The LRC has recently been refurbished to create some definitive spaces in which to learn.

There are silent study areas, seating for those working in groups and more than 150 computers. The LRC is also home to the wellbeing team and Study Support Base. Upstairs you will find the Careers Advisers. The LRC is open for private study until 6pm Monday to Thursday during term time.

Art & Design Centres

An inspiring environment with workshop and studio spaces equipped with a wealth of specialist equipment across our range of Art & Design courses. The Graphic Design and Photography suites benefit from high specification PCs installed with industry-standard software, networked to A3 Laser duplex colour printers.

Priestley School of Performance & Media

The Costello Theatre comes into its own on performance nights creating an atmosphere akin to a professional theatre. Those studying Performing Arts, Production Arts, Music and Media benefit from many first-class facilities including:

Science Laboratories

More than £350,000 has been invested in laboratories that boast high-tech equipment including fume cupboards and university-standard analytical balances. All science laboratories are equipped with university-standard apparatus for Biology, Chemistry, Electronics, Physics and Applied Science.

Languages

Languages at Priestley have a dedicated teaching room and a room for one-to-one speaking lessons. Students use chrome books and use a range of language learning platforms to optimize learning opportunities inside and outside the classroom.

Sports Centre

Our Sports Centre houses a basketball court and newly-equipped gym. The £625,000 All Weather Sports Pitch is available to the whole college community, including students opting to study sport academically or those taking part in enrichment activities

Outdoor Spaces

There are several spots around the campus where you can relax outside. There is some undercover seating linked to the Crescent Café, a mini outdoor theatre surrounded by greenery that is very relaxing as well as a large space in the centre of campus with benches and tables.

Viola Beach Café & Costa / Crescent Café & Starbucks

Visit the Viola Beach Café where there is space to relax and where we hold regular open mic sessions. Upstairs is The Mez where we serve Costa Coffee as well as seating for groups. The Crescent Café provides freshly-prepared food including a salad bar, sandwiches, wraps, soups and other hot meals including breakfast. Cashless Catering allows students to pay for meals using their ID card. Your account can be topped up online or at one of the top-up machines in college.

University Connections

Priestley arranges a trip to one of the largest UCAS conventions to meet around 100 universities and employers. Universities visit college to answer students' questions and numerous curriculum-focussed activities are also arranged.

Careers Programme

We have a robust careers programme to ensure students get the best possible advice and guidance to support their future aspirations. We organise a successful Careers Fair and students participate in a balanced tutorial and careers programme in line with Gatsby benchmarks.

Industry Partnerships

Working with industry partners and our careers advisers has helped guide students towards apprenticeships with companies such as Barclays, Jaguar and Fujitsu. Other students have progressed to careers as diverse as nuclear engineers, NHS workers and Royal Marines.

Medical and Veterinary Careers

Prepare for a career in Medicine, Dentistry or Veterinary science with the help of tutors and strong university links. Hear from guest speakers including practitioners and current medical students.

Legal Professions

As well as the Pre Med and Pre Law programmes that help students focus on careers in those areas, The Graduate raises aspirations for anyone aiming to study at the UK's most competitive universities. Priestley has other strong links with Oxford and Cambridge universities that help inspire our students to achieve great things.

Oxford And Cambridge

One of the major links you will benefit from is our status as the North West hub for OxNet – a programme run by the University of Oxford and Pembroke College that is aimed at making higher education more accessible. OxNet is unapologetically academic in its focus and has had a significant impact in the local communities in which it has worked. Together we run a rigorous academic programme featuring seminars and conferences.

The University of Oxford's relationship with The Challenge Academy Trust also gives our students access to specialist STEM and languages support sessions, academic talks, experimental facilities and latest research.

If you choose Priestley you will also benefit from our link with Cambridge as we take part in HE+, a year-long programme that includes academic extension classes, subject masterclasses, information and guidance sessions and a visit to the university.

Academies

Your timetable will be adjusted to allow for two training sessions and Wednesday afternoons will be kept free for competitions.

Represent Sport Priestley

We will provide opportunities to compete regionally in netball, badminton, basketball, cross country, futsal, golf, handball, football seven-a-side, hockey, rugby, swimming, table tennis and volleyball. You could also be asked to represent the North West at the AoC Sport National Championships.

Coaching and Refereeing

For anyone wanting to become a coach or referee there are opportunities to develop your leadership skills and qualifications at Priestley thanks to our partnerships including the TCAT Sport Hub, Warrington Wolves, School Games and WASSP. We also support you in gaining refereeing experience, coaching badges and First Aid certificates.

Trips and Visits

In recent years trips have included a US football tour, warm weather training at La Santa in Lanzarote, outdoor adventure in the Lake District and with Manor Adventure in Lockerbie.

Sport for All

As part of Priestley+ there are various sporting activities open to everyone in college so look out for those opportunities. We are open to suggestions about which activities should be offered.

Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme

Priestley is an accredited Talented Athlete Scholarship Scheme (TASS) college recognising how we support students in achieving both their sporting and academic goals.

Among those recently selected for the programme were GB rowers, jujitsu athletes, swimmers, kickboxers, as well as regional Thai boxers and rugby players. It means we offer extra support – such as virtual catchup sessions to review work – when a student is competing in their sport away from home.

Priestley has STEM-assured status which has been described as the national 'gold standard' for these subjects.

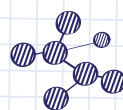
It means we attract some of the brightest young minds to study these subjects as our results and achievements across Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths demonstrate.

Priestley's STEM status is determined by the quality of its teachers, facilities such as university-standard laboratories and the technology centre as well as our links with major employers.

More than 60 organisations provide work experience, workshops or assignments including Oxford University, the Environment Agency, Sellafield, Barclays, Warrington Borough Council and the MoD.

Our Biology students completed a successful residential to Ecuador in 2022.

Priestley has won a national competition to design an app several times in recent years.

Eminent speakers visit college annually to discuss their expertise and students also benefit from prestigious work experience placements.

YOUR WELLBEING

Our Pastoral Team will be there for you

Your mental health and general wellbeing are two of our biggest priorities at Priestley. We are committed to ensuring your time at college is a happy, as well as successful, one.

Students are assigned a Pastoral Tutor who can be their first port of call when in need of support. These tutors will also help you in many other ways during weekly tutorials including developing study skills, completing job applications and planning your next steps.

Downstairs in the LRC we have a dedicated Wellbeing Hub where you will find our Wellbeing Practitioner and College Counsellor. You can request support from a member of the Wellbeing Team online and they can offer short or long-term support.

They help students with anxiety, depression, mental health concerns as well as other personal issues.

Priestley will also work with external partners to ensure you get the support you need both in and out of college.

We also have staff who are trained as Mental Health First Aiders who can support you during times of need, and student mental health ambassadors who raise awareness of Wellbeing and Mental Health across the college.

Priestley will support you every step of the way

Travel

Travelling to Priestley could not be easier. The college is located just off the A49 in south Warrington (Wilderspool Causeway) so there is excellent access to many bus routes run by Warrington's Own Buses and Arriva.

Warrington's Own Buses and Selwyns run direct services to college and you can find out more about those on our website where there is also a cycling and walking route map.

We are also within walking distance of the town centre, the interchange and the two main train stations.

Bursaries

In 2022 the college was able to offer the following bursaries to support many students.

Vulnerable Learner Bursary

Worth £1,200 in addition to Free School Meals and were available to young people in care or who were care leavers or who were in receipt of certain state benefits.

Free School Meals And Core Bursary

The Core Bursary can help pay for public transport to college. Anyone entitled to the Core Bursary was entitled to Free School Meal funding of £3 for each day in college.

Mainstream Bursary

These bursaries were for those students not eligible for a Core Bursary where their parents or carers have an annual income of less than £25,000, the mainstream bursary can help pay for public transport to college.

PETT Bursary

If you are not eligible for one of the 16-18 bursaries you may be able to apply for a bursary from the Priestley Education and Training Trust. Please speak to someone in Student Services about this. Details of the 2023 bursaries will be published on our website in summer once the level of Government funding has been confirmed.

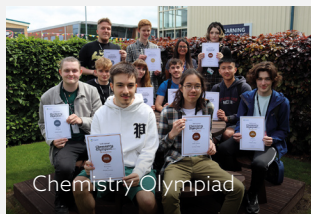

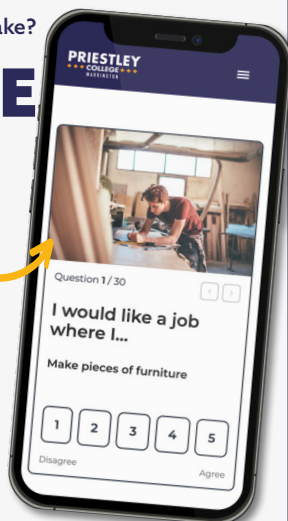
How to choose the right course for you?

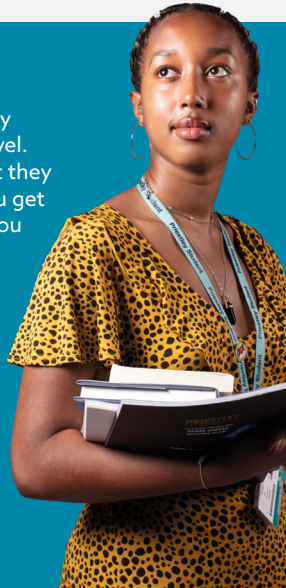

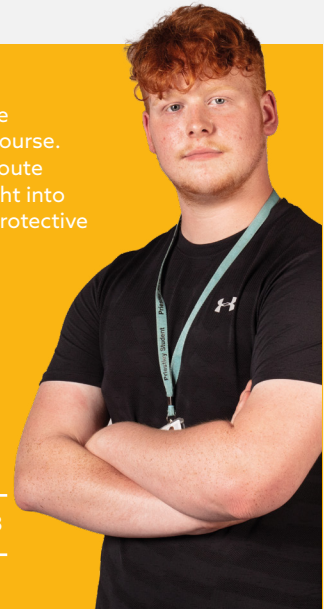

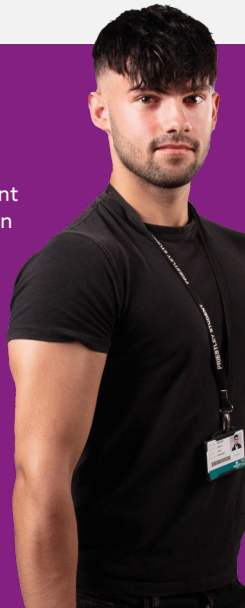

AS-Levels are the first year of an A-Level and, at Priestley, are qualifications in their own right.

That means even if you narrow your academic programme in Year 2 you will still have all the AS-Level qualifications you complete in Year 1 and these can be used for UCAS points.

We encourage you to take four AS-Levels in Year 1 giving you a greater breadth of subjects areas.

Other benefits of AS-Levels include:

- universities can use AS grades to help them make offers
- they demonstrate the progress you have made since GCSE
- they are a good way to assess your strengths

If you have a practical mind, a passion for problem solving and design then 3D Product Design & Technology could be for you. It will help you progress into areas as varied as 3D Design, Business, Sports Design, Ergonomics, Automotive Design and Architecture. You will study different construction materials, design solutions, different products and how they relate to modern manufacturing. Leads to university or apprenticeships and gives you the chance to work with real clients solving their design challenges.

A-Level Chemistry

This course prepares you for university, apprenticeships and careers as varied as Medicine, Dentistry, Forensics, Food and Textiles Sciences, Pharmacy, Chemical Engineering and Biochemistry. You will have the chance to represent the college in the Cambridge Chemistry Challenge, Young Analyst and the Royal Society of Chemistry Olympiad.

A-Level Classical Civilisation

You'll develop a range of skills including writing and analysing texts. It is ideal preparation for university degrees including Classics, History and Anthropology.

A-Level Dance

A stimulating and exciting exploration into the world of professional dance, this course will prepare you for further dance studies at university. You will develop technical, performance, creative and theoretical dance skills. There will be many opportunities to perform in front of live audiences. During the course you will explore choreography skills as well as analyse the work of professional dance companies and engage in visiting professional workshops with companies such as Rambert or New Adventures. Course includes theatre trips and the chance to visit Broadway.

A-Level Digital Photography

You will learn how to use your camera to respond to creative assignments, composition as well as refining your images sensitively, using a computer to digitally edit images or using hand-rendered art-based processes. The course explores different areas of photography such as environments, portraiture, landscape, still-life, documentary, photojournalism and experimental imagery. You will gain influence from other artists and photographers to inspire your own work. Students can progress directly onto photography-related degree courses at university, Art Foundation or consider working within a photography-based career.

A-Level Economics

A-Level Electronics

There is a coursework component which accounts for 20% of the total marks. Next steps could include electronic engineering courses at university and apprenticeship schemes

A-Level English Language and Literature

You will develop a variety of skills that are highly-regarded by employers and universities, preparing you for careers in areas as varied as publishing, PR, marketing, journalism, the legal profession and teaching.

This course can lead to a range of university degrees and careers that require good communication skills, such as publishing, public relations, marketing, journalism, media, management, teaching and many others.

It can lead to environmental degrees or university study in Geography, Geology, Climatology and other Earth Sciences. A-Level Further Mathematics

In Further Mathematics you will study topics that give you a breadth and depth to your mathematical knowledge. The course covers Further Pure, Further Statistics and Further Mechanics. In Further Pure you will cover topics such as complex numbers, matrices, proof and vector geometry. Dimensional analysis, work, energy and power, momentum and circular motion are covered in Further Mechanics. Probability, probability distributions, correlation and linear regression are covered in Further Statistics. Progression includes university and a wide range of careers.

A-Level Geography

Learn about tectonic processes, glaciated landscapes as well as globalisation and the regeneration of places. We will offer university language events, grammar and revision workshops.

A-Level Graphic Design

You will build a strong portfolio that will allow you to apply for top university places or go on to work in advertising, website design, illustration, computer game design, publishing or printmaking. During the course you will cover computer-based processes and techniques on industry-standard software (Adobe Creative Suite), create type and imagery and be encouraged to experiment with a wide range of more traditional methods. You will also learn specialist skills ranging from digital image making, advertising to typography and publishing.

A-Level History

Whatever option you take you can be sure lessons will be both challenging and inspiring.

This A-Level will introduce you to English law and the legal process. It is a highly-respected qualification and is certainly not limited to those who wish to pursue a legal career. Previous students are now working as solicitors or barristers while others are working for agencies such as the Crown Prosecution Service and the Ombudsman, taking legal apprenticeships or have become paralegals.

Our Vocational pathways are varied and far reaching. They can prepare you for university and careers as diverse as the police, theatre set designing or sports coaching to name just a few.

BTECs, OCRs, RSLs and Cambridge Technicals will give you the skills and knowledge you need to break into a particular industry. They can also lead you to university or apprenticeships.

Although some exams might be taken in certain Vocational courses, the focus is on coursework and assessments allowing you to build up to a final grade during the course.

You will still be required to have Level 3 entry requirements including at least five GCSEs at grade 4.

Vocational courses can be studied to different levels and the depth of the course will determine how much of your timetable your subject requires. In some cases this will allow you to combine a Vocational course with an A-Level.

Level 3 Applied Science

Take an exciting look at science through a mixture of theory, practical work and your own research. You'll complete case studies, assignments and projects linked to real-life workplace challenges. The course covers the fundamentals of Biology, Chemistry and Physics as well as specialist units in Human Physiology and an Investigative Project where you'll plan, carry out and analyse practical work on a topic of your own choosing. Develop independence as a learner and prepare for a career or higher-level study in paramedicine, nursing, pharmacy, optometry, zoology, marine biology or chemistry.

Level 3 Applied Human Biology

There will be opportunities to enter competitions such as The Student Investor Challenge which asks you to become a stockbroker. There are university courses in financial studies that offer a direct pathway of continued study in this field.

Level 3

- **Digital Production, Design and Development** Preparing you for careers such as web designer, computer games developer or software developer.

- **Education & Childcare** Preparing you for careers such as teaching assistant, nursery worker or portage home worker.

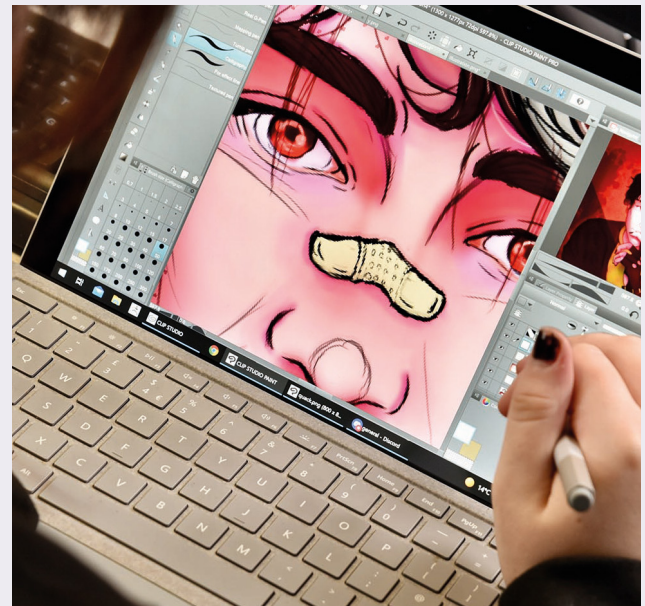
