# THE CHALLENGE OF EVIL AND SUFFERING

# NATURAL EVIL

Things that happen through natural causes such a natural disasters and illness.



### THE PROBLEM

We suffer because of **natural evil**, like earthquakes and floods and from **moral evil** like murder and bullying. But that doesn't make sense!

- if God created the world, he could have made it without natural disasters
- if God is all-powerful, he could stop suffering
- if God loves us, he would not want us to suffer
- if God is just, he would not let innocent people suffer.



#### EACHING

Some Christians believe that humans only suffer because they have sinned. The problem with this explanation is that it does not explain why the innocent suffer.

#### INFLUENCE

This view influences some Christians not to blame God for the bad things that happen to them.



#### TEACHING

Some Christians believe that evil and suffering are nothing to do with God and come from humans choosing to do evil things (using their free will). The problem with this is that is does not explain natural evil such as earthquakes.

#### NFLUENCE

This view influences some Christians to see evil and suffering as a test from God; to see if they will resist the temptation to choose to do evil things.

## MORAL EVIL

Things that happen because someone makes a decision to do something evil such as murder and terrorism.

# THE NATURE OF GOD


# IDEAS ABOUT HOW THE WORLD WAS MADE

# - GENESIS

#### TEACHING

The Creation story is mainly found in the first book of the Bible, Genesis. It tells how God created the world and everything in it from nothing. The Holy Spirit was present because it says 'The Spirit of God moved across the waters'. It took 6 days. The last thing he created was humans, who he made 'in his image'. On the seventh day, he rested.

# "In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."



Genesis talks of animals and humans being created at seemingly the same time but science tells us that humans evolved from animals over time

Genesis talks of the universe being created in a period of 6 days (the 7th day being when God rested) but science tells us that the universe was evolving over a significantly longer period.



What does this mean for Christians today who want to believe in the Bible?





# CHAMBERS Well a Market Story with a Market Sto

The story is factually true, God created the universe in 7 days.

Science is mistaken.

The story was never meant to explain how the universe was made but was meant to have a spiritual meaning about the nature of God, eg He is a powerful creator who put humans in charge of the earth.

Science and the story have different purposes.

# THE INCARNATION

#### **TEACHING**

The Bible teaches that the relationship between God and humans had become broken and so God decided to come down to earth Himself (in the form of Jesus) to fix it.

The plan was for Jesus to take on all the sins of people and die for them. This would mend the relationship between God and humans and would mean that, in the future, people who sinned could be forgiven and allowed into

# WHO WANTED JESUS TO DIE?

# 1, The Jewish Council Leaders (Sanhedrin)

Jesus' teachings about love and equality challenged their view of religion and they did not like it.

# 2, Pontius Pilate - The Roman Governor

The Romans ruled over the Jews and they had the final say on who was executed. Pilate initially wanted to release Jesus but then came under pressure from people saying that it would make him look bad to his superiors. He allowed another convict to be released instead.

#### 3, Jesus himself

It was always the plan that Jesus would die. This is because the whole reason he came to earth was to allow himself to be killed as a sacrifice. This sacrifice would then atone (make up for) all the sins that humans had committed and would therefore 'fix' the relationship between humans and God.

## KEY TEACHINGS

Christians believe that the purpose of the crucifixion was for Jesus to atone for the sins of humans by dying himself to mend the relationship between humans and God.

They also believe that he was brutally treated during his execution, eg he was whipped, had a crown of thorns pushed into his head and was then nailed to

# THE CRUCIFIXION

## WHAT CRIME WAS JESUS ACCUSED OF?

During his time on earth, Jesus told people that he was the Son of God. Whilst many people loved him for his new caring approach towards religion, many people found this claim disrespectful.

Their reason was that Jesus was a poor and gentle man and they were expecting the Son of God to be a powerful leader. Eventually, Jesus was arrested and charged with blasphemy (being disrespectful towards God) and was sentenced to be crucified.



#### **KEY EVENTS**

Jesus was arrested after one of his disciples, Judas, betrayed him. The Roman Governor, Pontius Pilate, sentenced him to be crucified. This was a method of execution often used by the Romans.

Jesus was nailed to a cross, with a crown of thorns on his head to make a joke of his crime - he was executed for being called the 'King of the Jews'.

It took 6 hours for Jesus to die. The Bible tells us that during this time, he forgave the people who were executing him and called out, 'My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?'. When he died, a Roman guard commented 'Surely this man was the Son of God'. One version of the story tells us that the sky went black and the Temple curtain was torn in two.

# THE RESURRECTION

## KEY EVENTS OF THE RESURRECTION

On the third day after his crucifixion, some of Jesus' women friends went to his tomb to care for his body. When they got there, the stone had been rolled away and the body was gone.

One version of the story tells how an angel told the women to seek Jesus among the living and one of them, Mary, saw him. The disciples were unbelieving at first, but Jesus showed himself to them too.

#### INFLUENCE

Believing that Jesus was resurrected can make Christians think that Jesus really was the Son of God and that they should follow his teachings.

# THE ASCENSION

#### **TEACHING**

40 days after his resurrection, Jesus takes his disciples to Bethany. They see him rising up

to Heaven and disappearing into a cloud.

Angels tell the disciples that he will return again in the same way he left them.

'I am only with you for a short time and then I am going to the one who sent me.'

#### INFLUENCE

Believing that Jesus ascended to Heaven and left his disciples to carry on his teachings can make Christians think that they should follow the teachings of his disciples as well as those of Jesus.

Believing that Jesus ascended to Heaven can also make Christians think that Jesus really was the Son of God and that they should follow his teachings.

Salvation refers to the view within Christianity that Christians have been saved by Jesus, through his death and resurrection, from sin and its consequences (death). This means Christians do not have to fear death, or punishment, and can have a new start, having faith that God Joves and cares for them.

# Salvation can be found through.....

GOD'S

GRACE

Jesus Jesus took the punishment for the sins of humans as an act of atonement – to pay the price and restore our relationship with God.

We could not do this on our own and needed Jesus's death on the cross to make it possible. His sacrifice means we can be saved.

W Before Jesus, Jews aimed to achieve salvation through following God's law (the Jewish law as written in the holy books), but many Christians believe that this was not a permanent solution, and Jesus' sacrifice replaced this.

Many Christians feel that they can receive God's grace through his teaching in the Bible and through sacraments; for example, reliving Jesus' sacrifice in the Eucharist, or accepting a new spiritual life through baptism.

SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit, the third Person of God in the Trinity, is also believed to be a means through which God can send his grace; by sending Christians the Holy Spirit to help them in their lives and faith.

# 14 SALVATION



Nicky Cruz was a violent gangster who was saved from a life of sin by God. He is an example of salvation.

# INFLUENCE

Believing that they can be saved from sin can make Christians feel that they do not have to fear death, or punishment, and can have a new start, having faith that God loves and cares for them.

It also makes them think that they should forgive others as they have faith that God is going to forgive them for their sins.

# TEACHING

A sin is an action that goes against God's will and separates us from him. For example, murder, theft, lying or adultery.

The Bible says 'the wages of sin is death' and Christians believe that on Judgement Day, our sins will count against us if we have not said sorry for them and we may be sent to Hell.



Original sin is the first ever sin committed in the Bible, when Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate from the tree of knowledge of good and evil. They were punished by being banished from the Garden of Eden and having to work hard and experience suffering.

Some Christians believe we have inherited this sin from Adam and Eve and it is as if we were part of it. Others believe the story shows that it is human nature to be sinful.

## INFLUENCE

Believing that Eve tempted Adam into disobeying God can cause some Christians to have a negative view of women.

Believing that humans were once close to God, before they sinned by disobeying Him, can make Christians think that it is possible to regain this type of relationship with Him again.

# **ATONEMENT**

# WHAT IS ATONEMENT?

Atonement is to do something to make up for sin (to try and put things right).

Atonement for Christians refers to how Jesus achieved salvation, and how he redeemed humans; his dying made up for (or atoned for) their sins, so saved them from the consequences.

How is it different to salvation? Salvation is <u>what</u> Jesus brought and atonement is <u>how</u> he did it (being crucified).

# TEACHINGS

That Jesus paid the price for the sins of humans by being crucified, his sacrifice then repaired the relationship between humans and God and meant that people who were sorry for their sins could go to Heaven when they died.

Some also believe that Jesus' sacrifice defeated the devil, so that he could no longer control sinners.

## INFLUENCE

Believing that Jesus suffered crucifixion to save them from sin can make Christians feel as though God loves them because he was willing to sacrifice his son for them.

This also makes Christians think that Jesus was the son of God because he was able to overcome death.
