#### Abortion



Abortion is the medical termination of a pregnancy.

It is legal in the UK up to 24 weeks of pregnancy, if it is needed to prevent damage to the mother's physical or mental health. It can be done after 24 weeks if there is a serious threat to the mother's life or the child's quality of life.

Pro-Life viewpoints - Belief in the sanctity of life, belief that life begins at conception so abortion is murder, belief that all life is valuable, belief that if it would be difficult to raise a child there are other options, such as adoption or asking for help from government e.g. benefits.

Pro-Choice viewpoints - Belief that we should consider if the child/mother will have a quality of life, belief that life does not start at conception, belief that in extreme cases abortion should be allowed e.g. in the case of rape

### Drugs

Drugs may be legal or illegal and can have various effects on the body. Taking an overdose of drugs can lead to death. For this reason, some drugs are illegal if thought to be too dangerous. Some people think the way to stop this harm is to legalise drugs.

Legalise - We would know what was in drugs and be given guidance on how much is safe to take, reducing deaths by accidental overdose.

Keep drugs illegal - They are dangerous and should not be made more accessible

We should focus on education as a way of reducing deaths

# Conflicts of Interest

A conflict of interest is hen two people/groups have a disagreement about what the best thing to do in a situation is.

There have been a number of cases involving conflicts of interest in medicine, often involving children such as Charlie Gard or Alfie Evans. Some people feel that doctors should have the final say in medical decisions because they are the experts, others feel that it is the parents' right to make medical decisions for their own children, as they would any other decision.

#### Contraception

Contraception stops a woman becoming pregnant. It can be temporary (e.g. condom) or permanent (e.g. hysterectomy - removing the uterus).

You can get free access to contraception at sexual health centres. However, some question whether everyone should have access to it, e.g. those under the age of consent (16).

There are different religious views on using contraception - e.g. some Christians believe they should not use it and follow God's plan, but others believe it is more loving not to bring a child into an environment where they may not be looked after.

## Fertility Treatment

Artificial Insemination and In Vitro
Fertilisation are processes that an
individual or a couple may take if
they are struggling to conceive a
child. They vary between injecting
sperm directly into the uterus to
mixing the sperm and egg outside of
the body.

# Genetic Engineering

Different views on fertility treatment

Allows people to have children, this is considered a gift

Christians follow the Bible command "Be fruitful and multiply" which means they should have children

There are plenty of children who need adopting – why not adopt rather than create more children?

Spare fertilised eggs used in fertility treatments are sometimes destroyed, and this may be viewed as murder by some.
