

- Of the 42 pupils in the whole school with at least one suspension in 2021/22, 52% were suspended on more than one occasion and none received 10 or more suspensions during the year.
- Of the 90 suspensions in the whole school in 2021/22, the following reasons each accounted for more than 10%: **persistent disruptive behaviour** (47), verbal abuse/threatening behaviour against an adult (17).
- There was 1 permanent exclusion in the whole school in 2021/22. The national average for this year was 2. There was also 1 in 2020/21 and 2 in 2019/20.

• The 1 permanent exclusion in the whole school in 2021/22 was for physical assault against an adult.
