

## Year 11 GCSE Drama Knowledge Organiser – Component 2: Performance from Text

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| <p><b><u>How to approach the script:</u></b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Highlight your lines.</li> <li>- Consider your motivation of your character (it might change! Why are they saying this? What is their objective at this point?)</li> <li>- Annotate the scripts with ideas/thoughts/interpretations you may be able to use.</li> <li>- Why is this monologue/duologue a key moment in the play?</li> <li>- What do you learn about your character from the extracts?</li> <li>- Rehearse! With a partner, with a parent/guardian, in front of the mirror, with your teacher!</li> </ul>                        | <p><b><u>What is your intention for performance? | <p><b><u>Physical Skills</u></b></p> <p><b>Facial Expressions:</b> Use of the face to show mood, feeling or character.</p> <p><b>Body Language:</b> Non-verbal communication using the body to show character/emotion.</p> <p><b>Levels:</b> The height a character is at (low or high) – can be used to show status</p> <p><b>Space:</b> Proxemics/Direction<br/> <b>Proxemics</b> – the space between characters to show a relationship.<br/> <b>Direction</b> – Space in which the character stands/moves.</p> <p><b>Posture:</b> How the body is held to show character or emotion</p> <p><b>Gesture</b> : An action of the body</p> | <p><b><u>Vocal Skills</u></b></p> <p><b>Pitch:</b> High or low use of voice.</p> <p><b>Pace:</b> Speed when delivering dialogue</p> <p><b>Tone:</b> How the voice conveys emotion</p> <p><b>Volume:</b> How loud or soft the dialogue is delivered</p> <p><b>Clarity:</b> The way the words are pronounced.</p> <p><b>Accent:</b> Shows where the character is from</p> <p><b>Inflection:</b> Using tone or pitch to emphasise certain words or phrases.</p> | <p><b><u>Assessment Objectives:</u></b></p> <p>In this component, you will be assessed on your ability to...</p> <p><b>AO2 – Apply theatrical skills to realise artistic intentions in live performance.</b></p> <p>How meaning is communicated through:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- themes, issues, performance conventions</li> <li>- genre, structure, form, style, language and stage directions</li> <li>- character relationships</li> <li>- character development.</li> </ul> |
