
Antarctica Location:



Deserts are very dry. They are found along the tropics of Capricorn and Cancer. Along the equator however we have a different ecosystem, here, we get rainforests. They get lots of rain which means that by the time the air reaches the tropics it is very **dry**. This is why **deserts** have very little rain. As there is a lack of **cloud** cover, temperatures can plummet below freezing of a night.
