**Search Engine:** A search engine is a software system that is designed to carry out web searches.

**Hyperlink:** A hyperlink is what we use to move around the web from page to page. It could be a button, text or an image.

Search engines are programs that are designed to search the internet for us. They scour through all the billions of webpages, looking for information that matches what you are seeking. By using a search engine you can find information in seconds.

Websites are made up of a Head and a Body  
Head is not what you might think – It's not a heading on the page

Anything that you see on the page is put in the Body section

The Head section is information about the page not on it

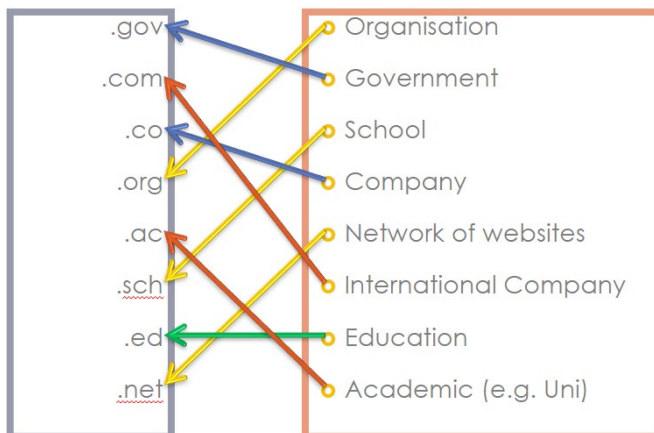
