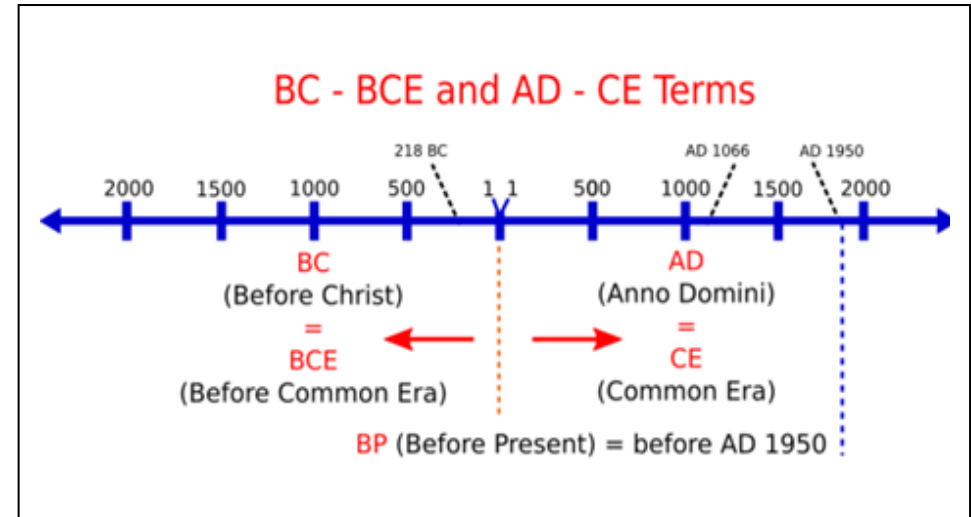

Section C Interpretations of History	<p>You will have an interpretation to examine about the experiences of black people in Britain after WWII. Is the opinion offered to you accurate? Does it match what you know about the experiences of black people in this period? You have to explain why the interpretation is accurate!</p> <p>Knowledge to help you! Immigration of black people from the Caribbean increased after WWII, after the arrival of the Empire Windrush in 1948. Black immigrants faced discrimination in terms of access to housing and job opportunities. They faced racism, leading to increased tension, which led to the Notting Hill Race Riots. Following this black people developed the Notting Hill Carnival. Racism persisted in the 1960s and 70s. They faced opposition from groups such as the National Front. 1981 saw riots in Liverpool about the conditions black people faced, including poor treatment from the police. The media often portrayed blacks in e negative light. However, during the 1970s opportunities for black actors and musicians increased, as Britain became a more multicultural society.</p>

Section D Source Utility	<p>You will have a source about the 1948 Berlin Airlift to look at. What does this source show, (we call this the content of the source)? How useful is the source, thinking about the provenance of it? Provenance means the type of source, is this helpful to understand the events of the Berlin Airlift? Look at when the source was produced, (its origin), why was the source produced, (Its purpose)? Are these useful when studying this event? You have to explain why the source you are looking at is useful if we are studying the events of the Berlin Airlift.</p> <p>Knowledge to help you! In 1948 Stalin, the Soviet leader closed off all road, rail and canal access to West Berlin, in Germany. This was the sector of Berlin that was under the rule of the US, Britain and France. In response the Allies launched the Berlin Airlift. Everyday hundreds of planes flew into Berlin delivering supplies of food and resources. Stalin dare not shoot these down, as this would be seen as an act of war.</p>

Section E Extended Writing	<p>“America’s development of the atomic bomb was the main cause for the outbreak of the Cold War after 1945.” You have to explain why some people might agree with this opinion and why other people might disagree with this opinion. Then you explain what is your opinion? Do you agree, partially agree, or disagree with the statement above?</p>	
	<p>Arguments in favour – The atomic bomb was most significant</p> <p><i>In 1945 Stalin was jealous that the USSR did not have an atomic bomb, and used scientists and spies to develop his own which he did by 1949. In response the USA began to develop more powerful atomic bombs, leading to the H-Bomb being developed. This all led to an arms race between the USA and the USSR, which massively increased tension and rivalry</i></p>	<p>Arguments against – Other factors were more significant</p> <p>The USA and the USSR has very different ideologies, capitalism and communism, the US President in 1945 (Truman) distrusted Stalin and hated Communism.</p> <p>The USSR had taken over the countries of Eastern Europe, and imposed Communism on these countries.. Both countries sent telegrams to each other warning the other sides were trying to take over the world</p>
